## Tesco Tokens

**Great news!** I have just received confirmation that we have been successful in our application to Tesco Stronger Starts and the public can vote for TEPA lunchtime provision from the first week in July 2025 until the end of September 2025!

I know many of us are frequent visitors to Tesco (March store) so know how the blue token system works but for those of you who are not familiar, for every £10 you spend instore, you will be given one blue token from the cashier or you can help yourself to a token (or two!) from the pot at each of the self serve checkouts. The blue tokens are then placed in one of three local community project boxes, of which we will be one of.



The project with the highest number of votes will receive £1,500, the second placed project £1,000 and the third placed project £500 all of which will be spent on enhancing the lunchtime provision for our pupils.

I will remind you all in the coming weeks but please do spread the word to family and friends. Don't forget to grab your blue tokens on paying for your shopping and let's get busy filling up project box! As the Tesco strapline says: 'Every Little Helps!'
